The Camp will accept only 20 players per age group/per gender. The Pro Elite Training Camp is looking for quality over quantity. This is a serious camp for serious players, although you do not need to play at the highest level for consideration. Submitting an application form with \$100.00 does not assure acceptance to the Camp staff will review Camp. applications and will mail out early acceptance letters after November 15, 2003 to players who are guaranteed enrollment in the Camp.

Once notified of acceptance, the balance of \$300 will be due and there will be no refunds. The staff will hold the Pro Elite Training

Camp rain or shine. Arrangements are being made to have preordered lunches available at a cost for the players (details to follow). Should you not be accepted to the Camp, your \$100 deposit will be refunded.

HSC Bulls – Dream Cruise – Fantasy Pass Fundraiser

A FANTASY PASS is a coupon that allows the holder to purchase up to ten Dream Cruises tickets under a single reservation at a 50% discount.

Dream Cruises will provide Fantasy Passes and Fundraiser flyers to each participating HSC Bulls team manager. Players sell the Fantasy Passes for \$10 each and turn in the proceeds to the Team Manager for credit to that plaver's account for team expenses such as Tournament fees, team travel, etc.

The purchaser can use the Fantasy Pass for any regularly scheduled Dream Cruise sailing through December 30, 2004 from either Oahu or the Big Island; subiect to available space. (Special Fireworks cruises on the 4th of July and New Years Eve are excluded). Purchaser may use multiple Passes on a single cruise, allowing a large party to sail at a discount (for example, four Passes may be used for a group of up to forty guests).

The current fundraiser period extends through December 15, 2003. Passes may be used for many uses, including entertaining visitors, personal or company holiday parties, birthday parties, etc.

For each participating team, Dream Cruises will provide two Dream Passes as an award to the highest selling Player. A Dream Pass allows that player to sail FREE on any regular Dream Cruise. The Manager should collect any unsold Fantasy Passes in late December and return them to Dream Cruises with the high-seller's name so that the Dream Passes may be issued.

Dream Cruises sails daily on Oahu from Kewalo Basin (Pacific Splash - Barefoot Fun Cruise, "Island Grill" Sunset Fun Cruise, and seasonal Humpback Whale Watching Cruise) and from Waianae (Wild Dolphin Eco-Adventure Cruises) on Oahu, and has similar cruises from Kailua-Kona on the Big Island.
