## **HSC Bulls U19 Boys Champions**

Congratulations on capturing the Region IV Championship, the first ever for a youth team from Hawaii. You now qualify for the US Youth Soccer National Championships at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Florida, July 20 - 25. Way to go. ## **Background on the United States Soccer Federation National Junior Challenge Cup**

Each summer U S Youth Soccer crowns a national champion, one for boys and one for girls, in the Under 16, Under 17, Under 18 and Under 19 age divisions. The finals are a culmination of a year long series of competitions at the state and regional level. State championships (often referred to as State Cups or SNICKERS Cups) are held in each of the 55 U S Youth Soccer affiliated State Associations some in the fall, but most throughout the spring. Champions are crowned for boys and girls in various age groups between Under 12 and Under 19. Champions in the Under 12, 14, 16, 17, 18 and 19 age divisions go on to represent their state at the regional competition.

The four regions host the next level of play in the National Championship tournament structure. The Regional Tournament is truly a tournament of champions as only teams who have won their state championships can participate in the Regional Tournament. Regional champions are determined in the Under 12, 14, 16, 17, 18 and 19 age divisions (also Under 13 and Under 15 in Region 1), boys and girls, with the champions in the Under 16 and above age divisions advancing to the National Championship finals.

The National Championship finals are played every July before thousands of spectators. This championship represents a

culmination of a year long effort by the four best boys and girls teams in the Under 16, Under 17, Under 18 and Under 19 age groups. Each team plays a semi-final match against another regional champion in his or her age group to advance to either the championship or the consolation game. The teams are competing for one of the eight championship cups that comprise the National Championship competition, and the honor of joining one of the most exclusive groups in the nation. Each year the names of the new champions and their home states join the list of other past champions, with their names engraved on their respective championship cups.

## **Why are you playing?**

### **James P. McGuire Cup Under-19 Boys**

The Under-19 Boys National Championship, the oldest of the 12, has been played annually since 1935, except during World War II. Originally known as the United States Soccer Federation National Junior Challenge Cup, the competition was renamed the James P. McGuire Junior Champion Cup in 1975, after the late United States Soccer Federation President. He played for the Brooklyn Wanderers in 1929, and later joined the Brooklyn St. Mary's Celtics who with McGuire at centre half won the U.S. Open Cup. James McGuire also served on World Cup and various other FIFA committees, and earned an international reputation as an excellent soccer administrator and leader.

## **Message from the President**

### Dues and Budgets

Thank you to the Dues Committee, Board of Directors and Coaches who all spent hours developing, reviewing and debating the 2004/2005 season budget. Your dedication to the Club and its players is very much appreciated.

Four years ago, the Club adopted its first budget designed to support professional coaching for our players. To minimize dues increases needed to support the increased costs, significant revenue from contributions, fundraising and events was budgeted, and budgets zeroed out - revenue was budgeted to cover operating costs only.

In the 2004/2005 season revenue budget, we more realistically budgeted contributions and fundraising revenue and designated event net income to provide Club cash reserves. Dues and uniform fees provide 95% of the revenue needed to support budgeted operating expenses of \$345,000. The operating expense budget continues to provide maximum support to coaching (64%), as much support as possible to player costs such as registration, uniforms, league fees, etc. (29%) and minimum to administration (7%).

Dues and uniform costs approved at the Annual General Meeting on June 6, 2004 by the HSC Bulls - Board for the August 1, 2004 - July 31, 2005 season are as follows:

Dues -

\$525 for U07

\$625 for U08 - U10

\$875 for U11 - U15

\$935 for U16 - U19

Uniform cost -

\$75 for U07 to U10

\$110 for U11 and older

In future years, the Club may elect to have the same dues for U11 and older and a two-tiered dues structure for U07 -U10, the same structure used in the Club's 2000/2001 season budget (so much for inventing something new in budgeting!). I also expect more funds will be needed to support administrative needs as less reliance is placed on volunteers. We hope net event income grows to provide a stable base for the Club.

Nick Roberts, professional player and coach from Manchester, England, previous assistant coach for the Columbus Crew and currently with the Santa Rosa Soccer Club, was recently interviewed in SOCCER JOURNAL magazine and I thought you might ponder two of his comments.

When asked how he defined a championship team, he replied, "excellent players, committed to winning and playing within a system that has to be taught through good coaching." Very timely comments considering our U19 Boys have just won the Far West Regionals, most of who have developed through DOC Neddo's system of playing the beautiful game.

Coach Roberts' other comment was that "in the youth game the focus should be on player development:" therefore, developing a team and players over a long period (many years) should be the goal. The goals should not always be related to winning, but also winning should not be discounted. Clearly, over that period there should be increased performance of individuals and the

team that leads the player and team development."

The commitment, dedication and hard work of the players and coaching staff for the U19 boys has paid off and has raised the bar for all of the younger Bulls players coming up through the ranks.
