To the Parents and Players,

On behalf of the staff of Kits 4
Kenyans, I would like to relay a note
of thanks for the donations of soccer
equipment to our program. Because
of your contributions, over two
hundred pounds of equipment was
collected and shipped to various
villages in Kenya. For many of you,
offering the extra equipment lying
around the house was as natural as
breathing. News of the collection
drive spread mainly by word of
mouth; so many of you probably
have only a vague idea of who we
are and what we do.

I started Kits 4 Kenyans after
returning from a trip to Kenya and
Tanzania in the summer of 2004. As
I toured through various rural towns
and villages, soccer was
everywhere. Despite the lack of
"real" equipment, children chased
down the cloth-and-fishnet balls with
a vigor and determination that made
you feel as if the World Cup was at
stake. Then, as you look around at
the poverty, you realize that this is



their World Cup. Soccer is what they live for. It provides both young and old with joy and pleasure in an otherwise depressing existence.

When I returned to Hawaii, I vowed to make a determined effort to do anything possible to help brighten the lives of Kenyans by providing them with adequate soccer equipment. Along with a few college teammates and classmates, we began organizing collection drives and canvassing for used soccer equipment in our respective home states. As always, the aloha spirit shined through as many parents and players from the Bulls Soccer Club donated any and all equipment lying around their houses. Some teammates even offered their game socks (right after playing a full 90 minutes at Waipio, of course). So it is with the utmost sincerity that I present my heartfelt thanks for your charity. Before I close, I want those who offered donations to realize that you are the brightest star for many of these kids in Kenya; and a shining example of generosity to myself and many others here in Hawaii.
