The Club recently held a New Player Orientation meeting to introduce new families, and to reacquaint current members, to the Honolulu Bulls. For those who were unable to attend, it is worthwhile reviewing some of the highlights of the excellent presentation by Board of Director, Mike Stollar, and the coaching staff.

First and foremost, we always promote our Club's philosophy. Our mission statement, formulated after a three day retreat, charges us to educate and develop our youth players to their highest potential through the culture of soccer; and to build and sustain a nationally and internationally recognized Club. Critical to this goal is to provide the highest level of coaching. Obviously we need a fiscally responsible administrative arm, the best coaching staff and highly motivated players on successful teams, and the resources through membership fees and sponsorships to make it all a reality.

These Board members are elected for staggered two year terms at the Annual General Membership meeting, held each year on the first Saturday in June. matters and it does this in partnership with the Bulls Board and the Staff Coaches.

Our Staff coaches are Phil Neddo (Director of Coaching), Michael Guidry PhD (Assistant DOC) and Jose Dydasco (Assistant DOC). Coach Jose is responsible for getting the youngest members to fall in love with the beautiful game by having fun at practices and games. Anyone who has witnessed Coach Jose in action at any of his sessions can attest to the fact that he is a big kid at heart helping the youngest players to have fun. Coach Guidry then channels this love for the game in these players in to knowing the game, knowing the various systems of play, developing skills (passing, shooting, free kicks). Winning is important at this age level both locally and in mainland tournaments, especially since part of our mission is to provide the opportunity for players to play in college, and they need to be seen and they need a stellar resume. Finally, Coach Neddo fine tunes the players 16 and older.

Everyone wants to be a victor. This is human nature. But success doesn't just happen. There is a process that needs to take place to shape and mold players and teams. The children need to have fun in the early and formative years, to learn the game, to practice hard especially on their own. We believe trusting in this system will lead to success down the road. Commitment is key. Our logo includes two stars; each signifying a National Championship ('85 Boys USYSA McGuire Cup, '88 Girls US Club National championship). These stars are a reflection of the system created by the HSC Bulls; a long term process of learning the game.

Of course, adequate resources are needed to achieve these goals, thus we have our membership fees. Yes,

being a member of the Bulls has a cost. All clubs have some basic similar costs: league fees, the newly instituted user fee for Waipio, two uniforms for each player, administrative expenses. League fees and Staff coaching salaries/benefits account for 75-80% of what you pay to become a member. We decided years ago not to "nickel and dime" you by asking for money every step of the way for uniforms, practice gear, tournament entry fees etc. Because we have all of these fixed costs, membership fees are not refundable.

Your team manager is critical to the success of your team and the club. Your team manager is responsible for facilitating registration with the club registrar for both the season and tournaments. Team snacks if applicable, team uniforms and laundry, practice gear, game schedules, fundraising and managing team finances comprise the bulk of what your team manager spearheads. The job is thankless at times; but your team's success hinges on all of the hard work put forth by your manager. All of these efforts make the coaches job all that much easier; so that they can focus on the game. Team managers meet monthly to discuss team and club matters; and they are charged with bringing this information back to the teams. Please help them as much as you can.

Parents, encourage your children. They need to be well rested and well nourished. A healthy lifestyle can only help to make the players more successful on the pitch.

So, welcome to the Honolulu Bulls. If you want to get more involved, have questions, concerns, suggestions please let your manager know so that input can get back to the coaches and Board.
